

## Race to the Stones Record Prize

### Qualifying Criteria

1. Starting in 2025, the Race to the Stones Record Prize ('the prize') will be £1000 for men and £1000 for women, increasing each year the prize is not won by £1000.
  - a. The men's prize was awarded in 2025, meaning in 2026 the men's prize resets to £1000
  - b. The women's prize was not awarded in 2025, meaning in 2026 the women's prize rolls over to £2000
2. The prize will be awarded via bank transfer within 28 days of the event, pending ratification of the course record.
3. The prize will only be awarded to:
  - a. A man who completes Race to the Stones 100km Non-Stop ('the event') in a time which is faster than the current male course record, which stands at 7 hours 41 minutes and 56 seconds as of August 2025.
  - b. A woman who completes Race to the Stones 100km Non-Stop in a time which is faster than the male course record, which stands at 9 hours 14 minutes and 14 seconds as of August 2025.
4. In the event that the prize is won, the prize will reset to £1000 for the following year *for the gender category in which it was won*. For example, if the prize is won by a woman in 2026 but *not* a man, then the prize for women in 2027 will reset to £1000 whilst the prize for men will increase to £2000.
5. In the event that two athletes break the course record, only the fastest will be awarded the prize.
6. In the interest of preserving a fair race for all, the prize will only be awarded to athletes who start in the first wave of the event.
7. In order to prevent cheating, the prize will only be awarded to athletes who are fitted with an official race tracker which must be booked in advance.
8. Athletes contending for the prize must adhere to all the [Terms and Conditions](#) of the Threshold Trail Series. Should the athlete be found to have broken the Terms and Conditions of the event the prize will not be awarded.
