Race to the Stones Record Prize

Qualifying Criteria

- 1. Starting in 2025, the Race to the Stones Record Prize ('the prize') will be £1000 for men and £1000 for women, increasing each year the prize is not won by £1000.
 - a. The men's prize was awarded in 2025, meaning in 2026 the men's prize resets to £1000
 - b. The women's prize was not awarded in 2025, meaning in 2026 the women's prize rolls over to £2000
- 2. The prize will be awarded via bank transfer within 28 days of the event, pending ratification of the course record.
- 3. The prize will only be awarded to:
 - a. A man who completes Race to the Stones 100km Non-Stop ('the event') in a time which is faster than the current male course record, which stands at 7 hours 41 minutes and 56 seconds as of August 2025.
 - b. A woman who completes Race to the Stones 100km Non-Stop in a time which is faster than the male course record, which stands at 9 hours 14 minutes and 14 seconds as of August 2025.
- 4. In the event that the prize is won, the prize will reset to £1000 for the following year for the gender category in which it was won. For example, if the prize is won by a woman in 2026 but not a man, then the prize for women in 2027 will reset to £1000 whilst the prize for men will increase to £2000.
- 5. In the event that two athletes break the course record, only the fastest will be awarded the prize.
- 6. In the interest of preserving a fair race for all, the prize will only be awarded to athletes who start in the first wave of the event.
- 7. In order to prevent cheating, the prize will only be awarded to athletes who are fitted with an official race tracker which must be booked in advance.
- 8. Athletes contending for the prize must adhere to all the <u>Terms and Conditions</u> of the Threshold Trail Series. Should the athlete be found to have broken the Terms and Conditions of the event the prize will not be awarded.
